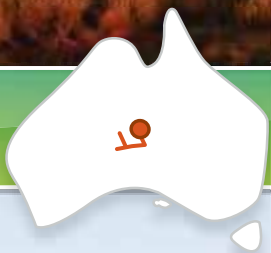

Sleep in a permanent tent or curl up for the night in a swag (optional) under millions of stars. (LD)

Day 2 – Uluru to Kings Canyon

An early start is rewarded with a glorious Uluru sunrise. Take a walk around the base of the Rock before meeting up for a cultural interpretive walk with an Aboriginal guide.* A truly unique opportunity to connect with and learn about the oldest culture on earth. Stop in at the Cultural Centre before we overnight in Kings Canyon. (BLD)

Day 3 – Kings Canyon to Alice Springs

Don hiking shoes to explore the impressive formations and towering cliffs of Kings Canyon. 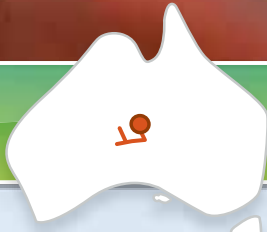

Day 1 – Alice Springs to Kings Canyon

Kick start your day with a camel ride at an outback camel farm (own expense) before we journey to Kings Canyon. Grab your hiking shoes and explore the Amphitheatre, the North and South Walls, the Lost City and the Garden of Eden. Sleep overnight in a swag (Aussie bedroll) under the clear desert night sky. (LD)

Day 2 – Kings Canyon to Uluru

Rise early and hit the road to Uluru. Walk a section of the base of the iconic Rock before gaining an insight into Aboriginal culture from your guide. We complete the afternoon watching the sunset over Uluru. It's pretty spectacular so make sure cameras are ready! A barbecue dinner caps off a great day in the Outback. (BLD)

Day 3 – Uluru to Alice Springs

Another early start to experience a magical Uluru sunrise before we visit the Cultural Centre for an insight into the Anangu way of life. Explore the ancient formation of Kata Tjuta on the Valley of the Winds hike before finishing your tour in Alice Springs. (BL)

Day 1 – Ayers Rock Resort to Kings Canyon

Depart Ayers Rock Resort early afternoon and enjoy a variety of Central Australia's outback scenery. We stop along the way to check out Kings Creek Station and enjoy a camel ride (seasonal and at own expense). When we reach our secluded campsite near Kings Canyon, roll up your sleeves and lend a hand with the dinner preparations. Spend the night in a permanent tent, or sleep under the outback stars in a swag (Aussie bedroll). (D)

Day 2 – Kings Canyon to Uluru

This morning, you'll be hiking Kings Canyon. Admire the sandstone domes of the Lost City, the cliff top views along the North and South Walls and the beauty of the Garden of Eden; all whilst learning about the flora, fauna, history and culture of this area from your knowledgeable guide. After lunch we head back to Uluru, with a stop on the way at Curtin Springs Station Roadhouse. See the fascinating red domes of Kata Tjuta on a walk through Walpa Gorge. Grab a glass of bubbly and enjoy a memorable Red Centre sunset. Tonight we camp at Yulara. (BLD)

Day 3 – Uluru

Rise early and be treated to a spectacular sunrise over iconic Uluru. While the morning is fresh, enjoy an unguided walk around the base of Ayers Rock. Deepen your understanding of the land and the story of the Mala people during a cultural interpretive walk with an Aboriginal guide (and interpreter)* – a truly unique and personal experience. The tour will finish at Ayers Rock Resort or Yulara Airport before lunch and in time for outbound flights. (B)

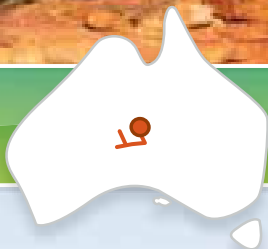

Day 2 – Kata Tjuta to Kings Canyon

Watch the sunrise breaking over the rolling domes of Kata Tjuta. Enjoy a 7km hike through the spectacular Valley of the Winds. Enroute to Kings Canyon, travel through the red desert that is the hallmark of Central Australia. Feast on a traditional camp oven dinner and discover constellations in the desert sky. (BLD)

Day 3 – Kings Canyon to Alice Springs

Within the imposing Kings Canyon, discover the Lost City and the Garden of Eden on a 7km hike. Admire the towering walls, crevices and plateau of magical Watarrka National Park where photo opportunities abound. Stop for a bite to eat before we journey back to the remote centre of Alice Springs. (BL)

Day 2 – Uluru to Kings Canyon

Including: Cairns<->Sydney<->Melbourne<->Adelaide<->Alice Springs (Unleashed 18-39 tours).

If you wish to transfer from one trip to another or transfer your booking to a third party you must notify us at least 42 days prior to the proposed departure date. A fee of AU\$100 per person per change may apply (in addition to any charges levied by hotels, ground operators or airlines). If you notify us less than 42 days prior to the proposed departure date our cancellation conditions apply.

Other Change/Amendment Fees for All Tours

Amendments to any other arrangements made in conjunction with your trip will incur an AU\$100 administration fee per booking per change. This fee is in addition to any charges levied by hotels, ground operators or airlines. No amendments are permitted to your booking within 7 days of departure. You are strongly advised to take out cancellation insurance at the time of booking which will cover cancellation fees. If you leave a trip for any reason after it has commenced we are not obliged to make any refunds for unused services.

6. Cancellation by Adventure Tours

We may cancel a trip at any time up to 28 days before departure. We may cancel a trip at any time prior to departure if, due to terrorism, natural disasters, political instability or other external events it is not viable for us to operate the planned itinerary. If we cancel your trip, you can transfer amounts paid to an alternate departure date or alternatively receive a full refund. In circumstances where the cancellation is due to external events outside our reasonable control refunds will be less any unrecoverable costs. We are not responsible for any incidental expenses that you may have incurred as a result of your booking including but not limited to visas, vaccinations, Travel Insurance excess or non-refundable flights. Please note that different cancellation conditions may apply to some Day Tours and Short Break Adventures - please ask us.

7. Prices & Surcharges

Our trip prices are based on currency exchange rates published by OANDA in August 2012. We reserve the right to impose surcharges up to 28 days before departure due to unfavourable changes in exchange rates, increases in airfares or other transportation costs, increases in local operator costs, taxes, or if government action should require us to do so. In such instances we will be responsible for the first 2% of the additional costs and you will be responsible for the balance. If any surcharge results in an increase of more than 10% of the trip price you may cancel the booking within 14 days of notification of the surcharge and obtain a full refund. We will not surcharge any booking for travel within the validity of this brochure once paid in full.

8. Minimum Numbers & Combination Trips

Some of our tours require minimum numbers to guarantee their departure. If you would like to know how many people are booked on your trip or any combination trip it is part of please ask prior to making your booking. Many of our trips are designed to fit with other departures to create a longer "combination" trip; this means that some of your group may have already been travelling together for some weeks when you commence your trip.

9. Travel Insurance

Travel Insurance is compulsory for all Adventure Tours travellers and should be taken out at the time of booking. Your Travel Insurance must provide cover against personal accident, death, medical expenses and emergency repatriation with a recommended minimum coverage of US\$200,000 for each of the categories of cover. You must provide proof of your Travel Insurance on the first day of your trip. However it is also recognised that in some countries (eg. Germany and Austria) local consumer laws do not permit the compulsory purchase of Travel Insurance. Clients from these exempt countries who choose to travel without holding an adequate and valid Travel Insurance policy will be asked to complete an Insurance Waiver form before commencement of their tour. Australians are not required to be covered for medical expenses on trips within Australia. However we strongly recommend that you have a domestic Travel Insurance policy which covers personal liability, cancellation, curtailment and loss of luggage and personal effects.

10. Age Requirements

For the majority of our trips the minimum age for children is 8. All travellers under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult who is responsible for the child's day to day care. Please note; families must upgrade from dorm-share accommodation to private rooms. On camping trips, accompanying adults may be required to share with others in the group on a twin share basis. Variations: a lower minimum age may apply on Short Break and Day Tours. Please be aware of our specially designed Unleashed 18-39 tours.

11. Flexibility

You appreciate and acknowledge that the nature of this type of travel requires considerable flexibility and you should allow for alternatives. The itinerary provided for each trip is representative of the types of activities contemplated, but it is understood that the route, schedules, itineraries, amenities and mode of transport may be subject to alteration without prior notice due to local circumstances or events.

12. Authority on Tour

Our group trips are run by a Tour Guide. The decision of the Tour Guide is final on all matters likely to affect the safety or well-being of any person participating in the trip. If you fail to comply with a decision made by a group leader, or interfere with the well-being or mobility of the group, the group leader may direct you to leave the trip immediately, with no right of refund.

13. Acceptance of Risk

You acknowledge that the nature of the trip is adventurous and participation involves a degree of personal risk. It is also your own responsibility to acquaint yourself with all possible relevant travel information and the nature of your itinerary. You acknowledge that your decision to travel is made in light of consideration of this information and you accept that you are aware of the personal risks attendant upon such travel.

14. Limitation of Liability

We contract with a network of companies, government agencies and individuals to assist in the running of our trips as agents for these third parties. We are not responsible for the acts and omissions of these third parties.

To the fullest extent of the law:

- Liability for any loss, death, injury or damage which you may suffer (directly or indirectly) in connection with or arising out of your participation in a trip, or any breach of the Booking Conditions, is excluded
- You release us and our officers, employees, agents and representatives from any liability and expressly waive any claims you may have against us arising out of or in connection with your participation in a trip.
- Any condition or warranty which would otherwise be implied by law into these Booking Conditions (Implied Warranty), is excluded. To the extent Implied Warranty cannot be excluded, our liability in respect of the Implied Warranty is limited to (in our absolute discretion): (i) the provision of a similar trip to an equivalent value; or (ii) a refund of the total amount received by us from you in connection with your booking.
- Any claim by you is excluded to the extent that it is for indirect or consequential loss, loss of profits or economic loss, however it arises, or for indirect, special, punitive or exemplary damages.

Optional Activities

Optional activities not included in the trip price do not form part of the trip or this contract. You accept that any assistance given by your Tour Guide or local representative in arranging optional activities does not render us liable for them in any way. The contract for the provision of that activity will be between you and the activity provider.

15. Claims & Complaints

If you have a complaint about your trip please inform your Tour Guide at the time in order that they can attempt to rectify the matter. If satisfaction is not reached through these means then any further complaint should be put in writing to us within 30 days of the end of the tour.

16. Severability

In the event that any term or condition contained in these Booking Conditions is unenforceable or void by operation of law or as being against public policy or for any other reason than such term or condition shall be deemed to be severed from this contract or amended accordingly only to such extent necessary to allow all remaining terms and conditions to survive and continue as binding.

17. Privacy Policy

Any personal information that we collect about you may be used for any purpose associated with the operation of a Trip or to send you marketing material in relation to our events and special offers. The information may be disclosed to our agents, service providers or other suppliers to enable us to operate the Trip. We will otherwise treat your details in accordance with our privacy policy (available for viewing on our Website).

18. Applicable Law

The laws of Victoria, Australia govern these Booking Conditions to the fullest extent allowable. Any disputes in connection with a trip or these Booking Conditions must be initiated in the courts of Victoria, Australia.
